Principal's report (Katie Berg)

- Family Math Night on Sept. 28, 6-7 p.m.
 - Please bring your kids!
 - Each grade level has their own room, so you will be learning things specific to your child's grade level
 - Learn math games to play with your child
 - Raffles in every room
 - The Google Form to sign up is to help staff gauge numbers you can still turn up without registering
- Payne is a Title I school
 - This means that a portion of the student population is entitled to free lunch

- Please complete the survey that was shared even if you know that your family wouldn't qualify, we need everyone to complete it
- Criteria to qualify as a Title I school are getting harder and we're right on the border for next year
- Title I schools are given additional funding, with parameters around how to spend it to serve Title I students
- (Handed out an in-person survey to attending parents asking what their preferred methods of communication are)
- School Site Council
 - The council is a very small group of parents and staff members (about 3-4 of each)
 - They meet 3-4 times per year via Zoom after school (3:15 p.m.) the meetings are very quick and easy
 - They help direct the school plan, which lays out where every dollar goes, who it helps, what our goals are, etc.
 - We ask (tentatively) for a two-year commitment, but you can also stay longer than two years
- Moreland School District recently emailed about the Care Solace Partnership
 - Organization that helps students and families connect with mental health resources
 - Reach out to Katie and she can refer you over to Care Solace; it's all confidential from there
 - They do all the searching for you; they take out the administrative work of searching for providers that accept your insurance, etc.
- Ways to support your child in school
 - Monitor your child's progress
 - Most important is having a "how are you doing?" conversation for Elementary students
 - Reading at home
 - Get involved at home (by having conversations with your child) and as a volunteer
 - Attend parent teacher conferences coming up in November
 - (A handout was distributed to parent attendees with more tips on how to support your child)
 - Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS) is the behavior support system that Payne has been using for years
 - E.g. teachers meet before school starts to lay down the rules for the playground, down to the fine details of how to fairly and safely use equipment. Then they held playground meetings with students to let them know the rules.
 - In classrooms, teachers start with our five principles to be safe, responsible, respectful, resilient, and kind

- They learn there are five expectations (posted in library and in classrooms), phrased as behaviors they should exhibit (rather than "what not to do")
- We also have a Panther Pact for every area in the school and there's a video that's shown in every classroom that goes over these (handout shared of the Panther Pacts to attending parents)
- We also teach problem-solving strategies:
 - Say "stop" (e.g. sometimes the other child is just having fun and doesn't know that you're being bothered, so communicating that you want them to stop is an important skill)
 - Walk away (e.g. explain "I don't like the way you're playing so I'm going to walk away" and then walk away)
 - Talk to an adult (i.e. if the above two steps don't work, talk to a teacher)
- If the above approaches are not working, we give students reminders and little lessons. For repeated or large acts, students will go to the office. We don't believe that instant punitive consequences work; we take a restorative approach.
 - Office staff members work hard to build those relationships with the students. They know and trust the staff; they know that they care.
 - Taking attendance seriously is important including not being tardy. Missing parts of class can be difficult for students.
- When your child is struggling...
 - One tip for upper grade students is to help your child email their own teacher if they are struggling or need help this is a skill that will be needed as they progress to higher grades
