



Request for funds: Promethean Smart Boards for kinder classrooms



How will the boards be used?

- Core Curriculum applications
- Introduce new websites/apps to students and guide them in exploring the site as a whole group before they use it independently
- Online Scholastic news with the class as they use their own magazines
- Word Study exercises that allow students to move letters and words around without the anxiety of making a mistake
- Kinder classrooms only have a small amount of whiteboard space and the projector is on the other side of the room. The smart board will allow teachers to show slides and lessons and allow students to interact instead of us having to move the objects on the computer or draw on the whiteboard.
- Allows more opportunities for students to interact and keeps them engaged
- Students can write on it using their fingers, great for the beginning of the year and helps students develop better fine motor skills
- Writing on a vertical board also encourages better pencil grasp and fine motor control of writing utensils
