Principal's report

- State testing starts next Tuesday, want kids in right mindset to do their best - well fed and well rested!
 - Two weeks of testing for 3rd and 4th grades
 - Three weeks for 5th grade because it includes a science test

- Make-up tests for students who run out of time during test
- Question: Are they adaptive tests?
 - No, though the questions will vary for different kids (randomized)
- Request for HSC funds to purchase Promethean Smart Boards for kinder classrooms
 - We had two to try out in two special education classes and the teachers and kids loved them
 - See how the boards will be used on [Slide 12](#)
 - Note: kinder teachers are careful about how much tech/screen time they give students in class
 - These boards will help develop fine motor skills
 - Note: one of the impacts of the pandemic that teachers have noticed is that kindergartners this year have been more independent with letters and sounds than typical kindergartners in the past, though less developed with fine motor skills and in collaborating with others.
 - District can't fund these but they would supported the technology going forward, so HSC won't be responsible for software/maintenance costs
 - Question: How sturdy are they for kindergartner use?
 - The two boards in the special education kinder classes have endured!
 - Vote result: approved

Question re: break-ins recently?

- We had one weekend recently where a window was broken on a Friday evening, then another broken on Saturday - both from outside, no entry made into building
